How to Do Things Right

Situation

In this lesson, Ermanno and Oliver reflect on the typical actions of a particular profession: the waiter (der Kellner). They admire the waiter who performs his work in a way that is not meant to be noticed but is perfectly useful and right.



Lesson

Exploring the Masculine Accusative Case in German: from 'der' to 'den'.

- Der Kellner schneidet die Zitrone (feminine – unchanged).
- Der Kellner schneidet das Brot (neuter – unchanged).
- Der Kellner schneidet den Kuchen (masculine – changes from 'der' to 'den').
